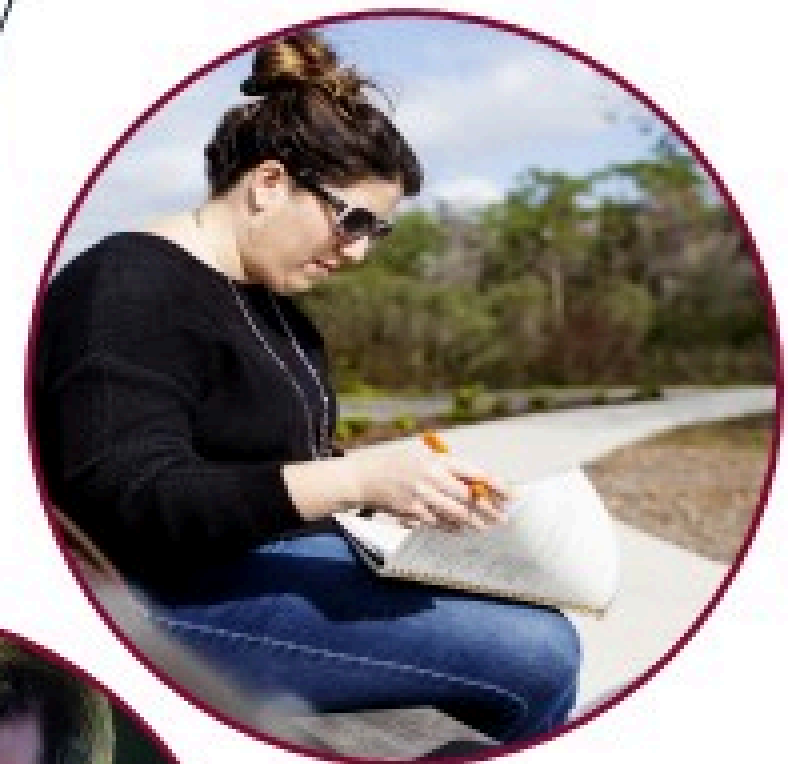
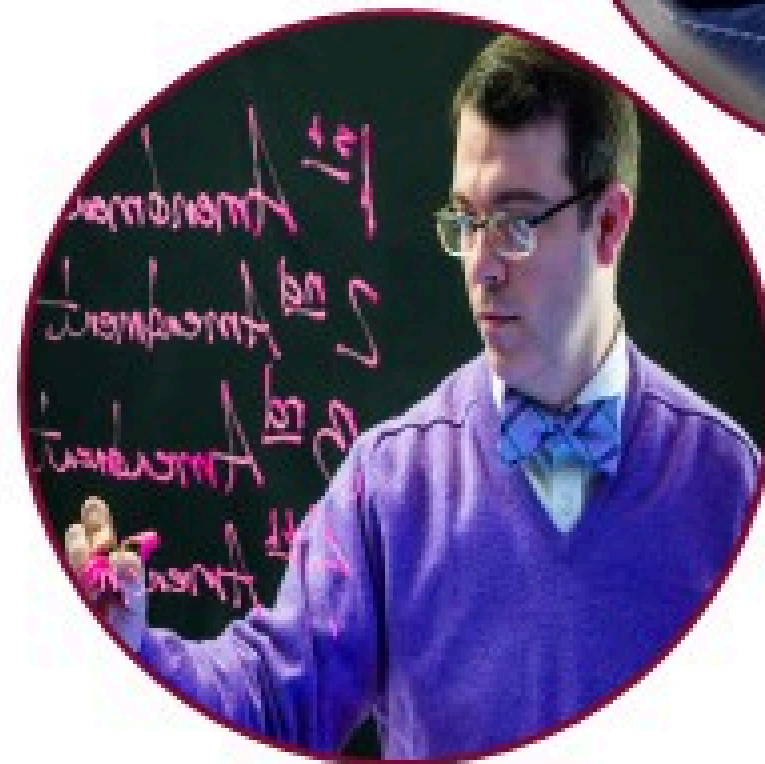

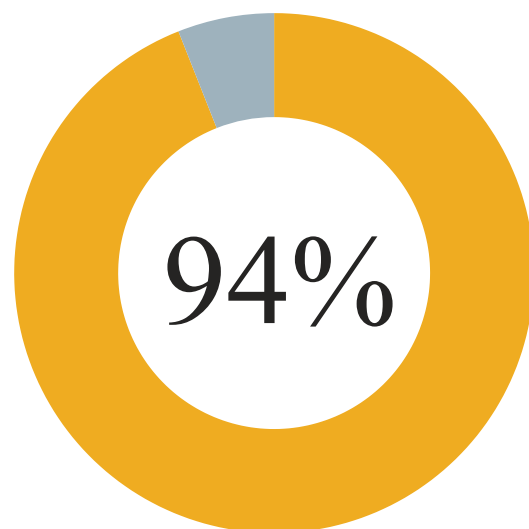
# Facts and Figures

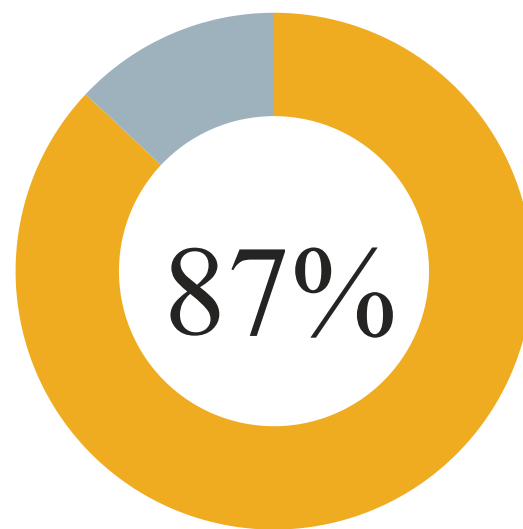

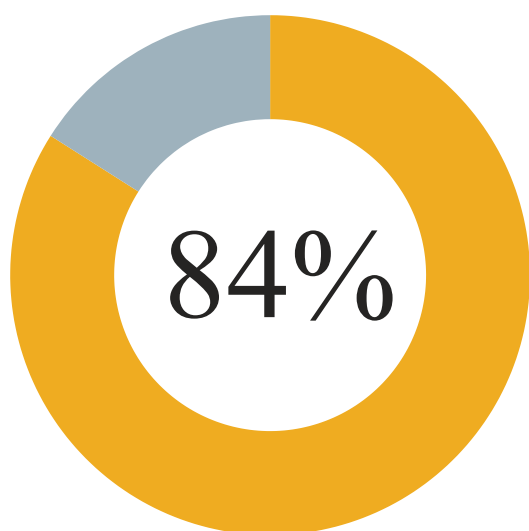

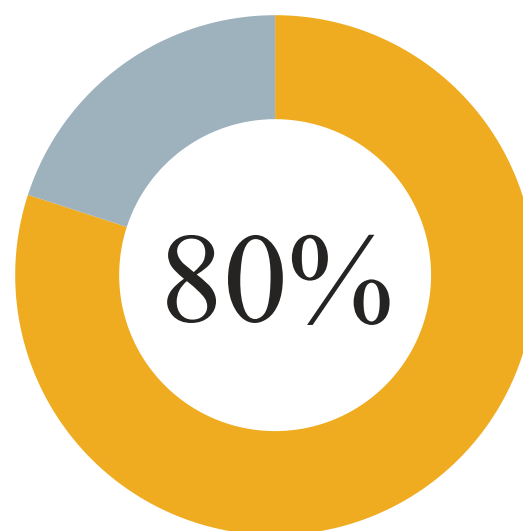

## Net Promoter Score

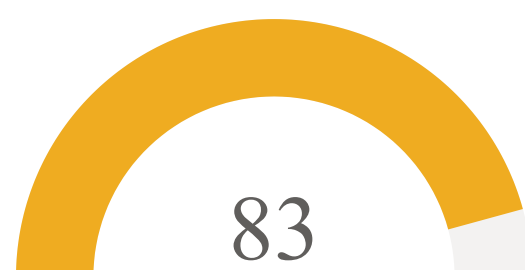

### How likely are you to recommend ACE to others?

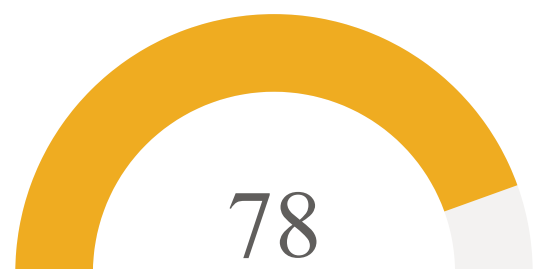

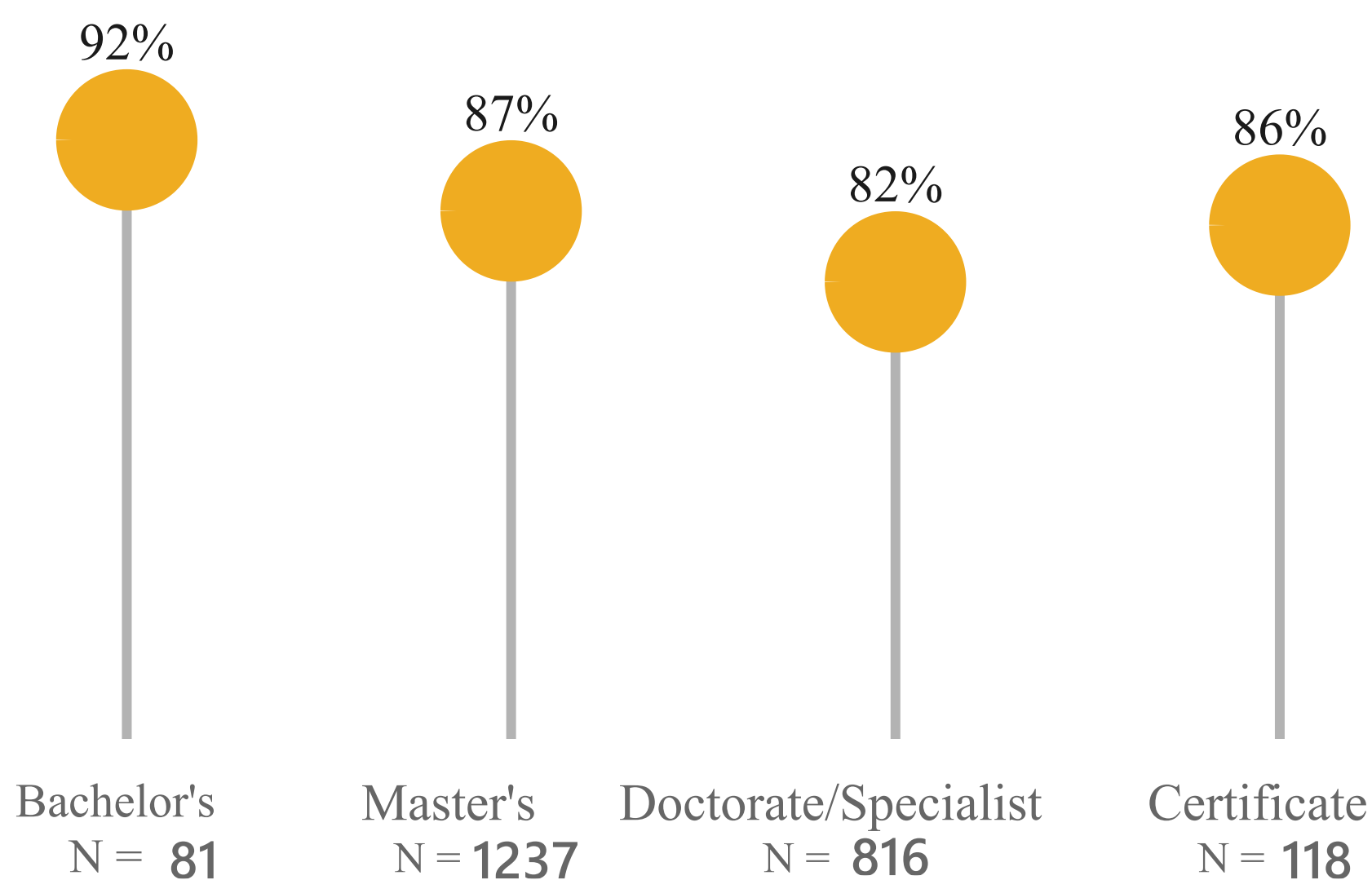

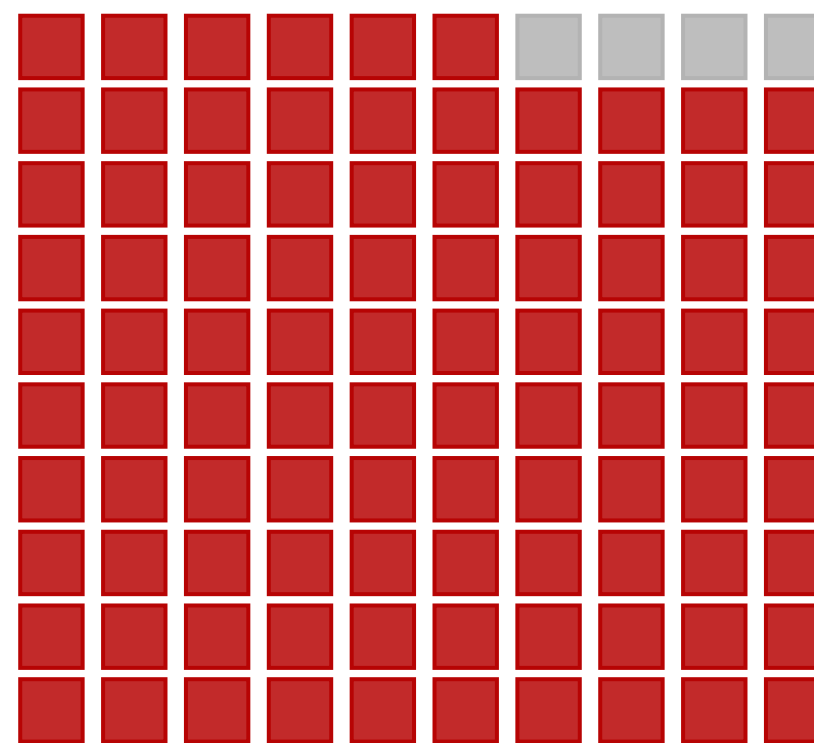

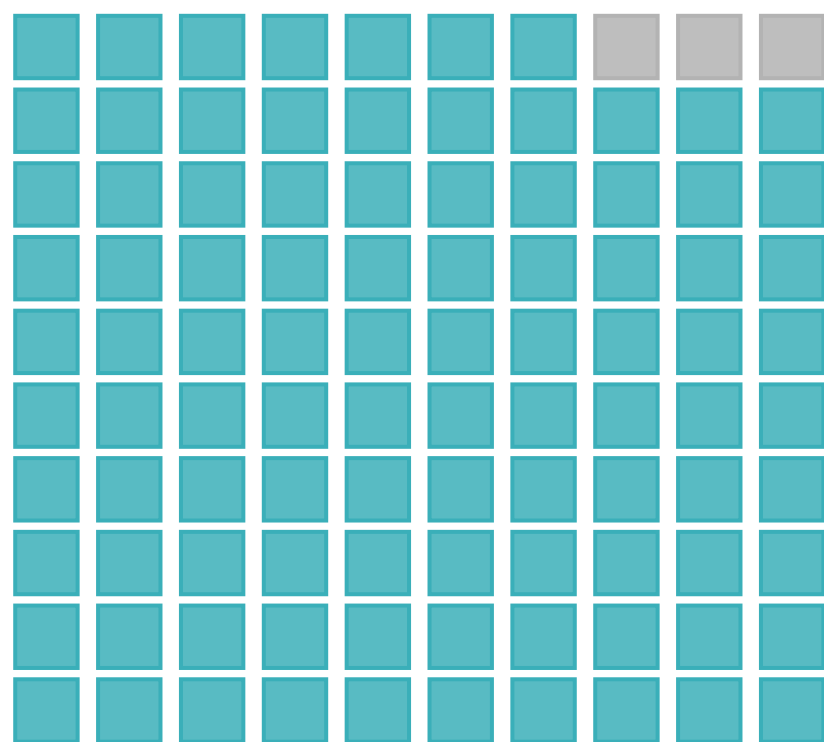

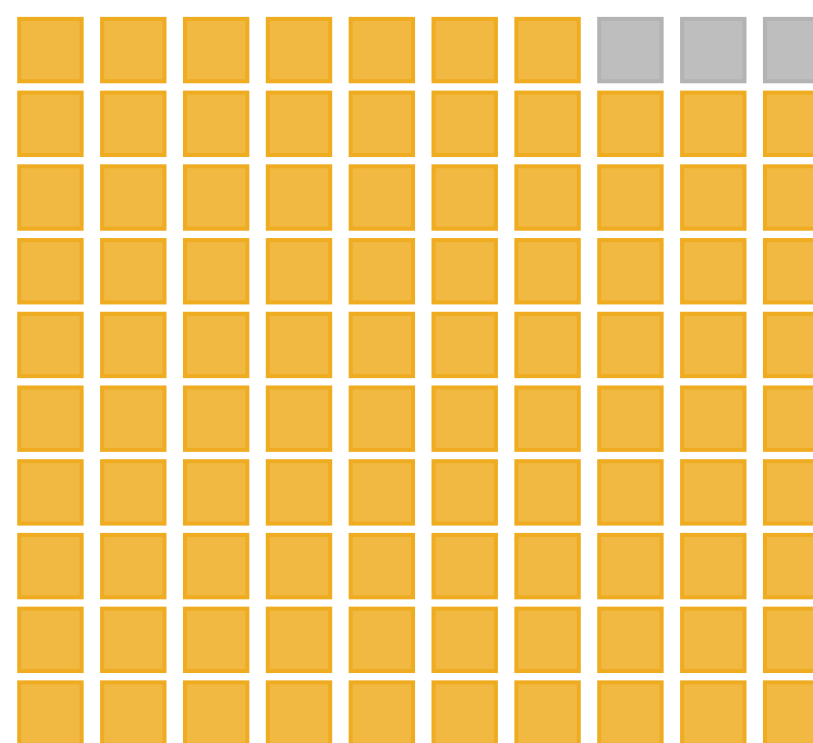

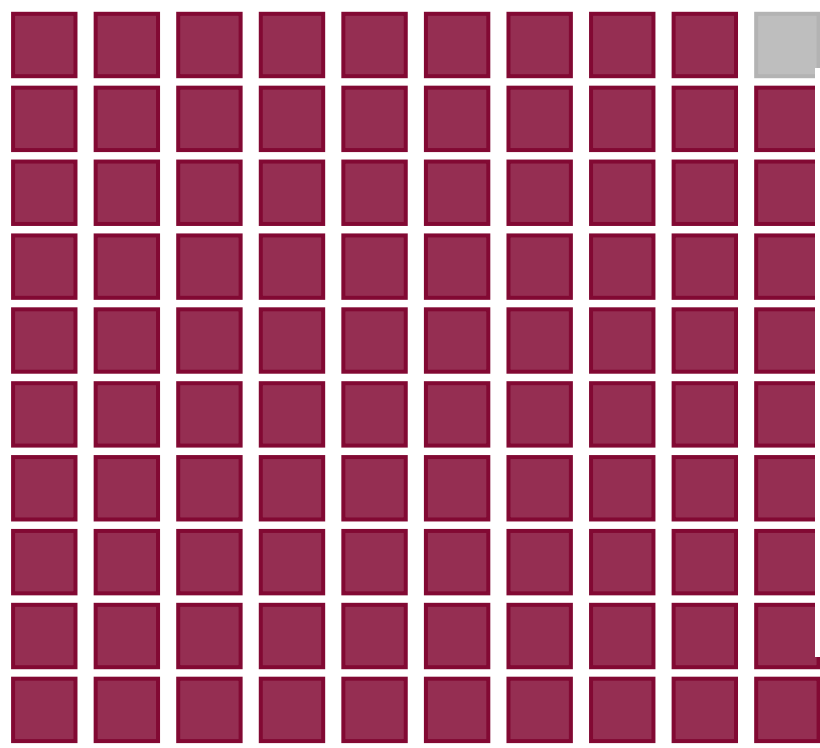

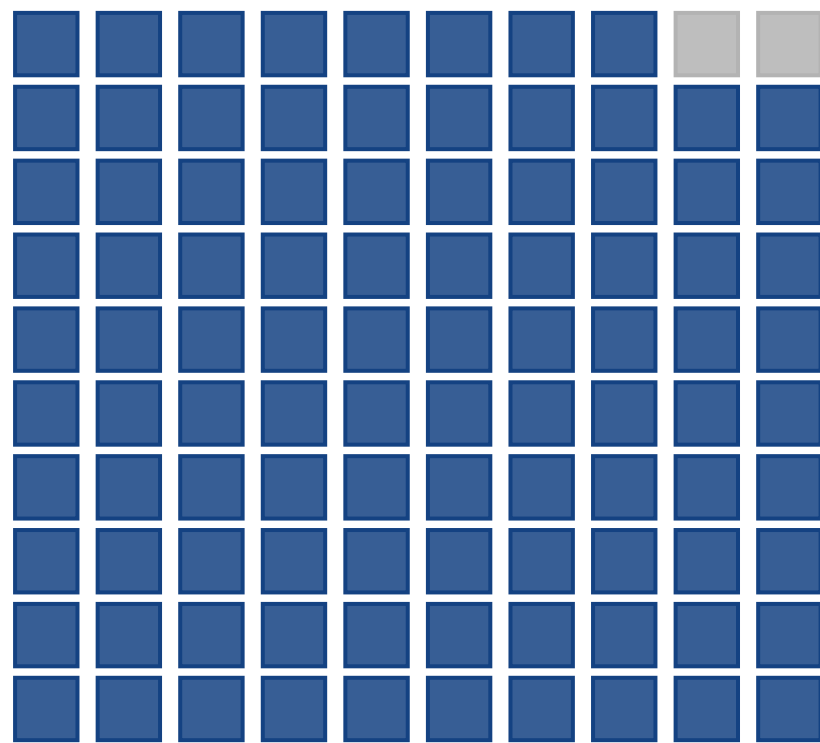

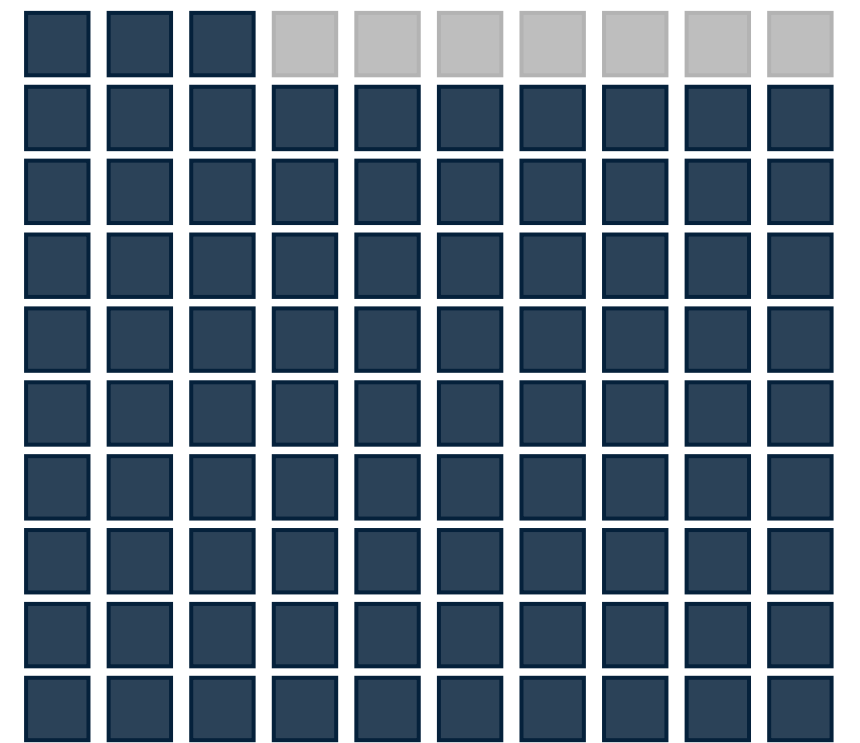

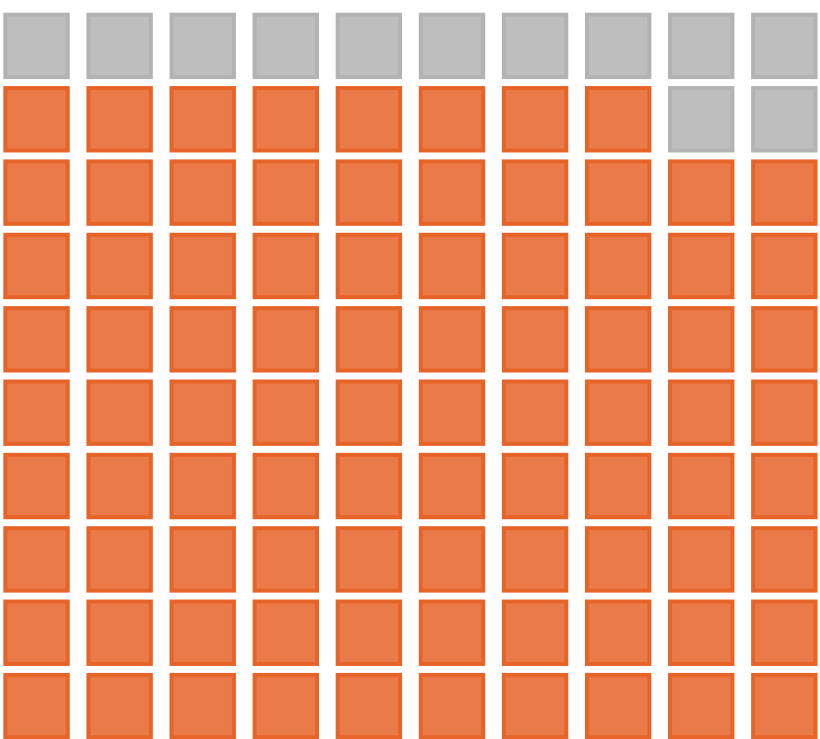

ACE offers several programs that can lead to teacher or school administrator certification in certain states.

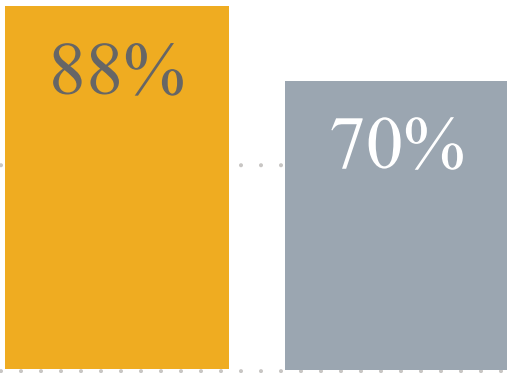

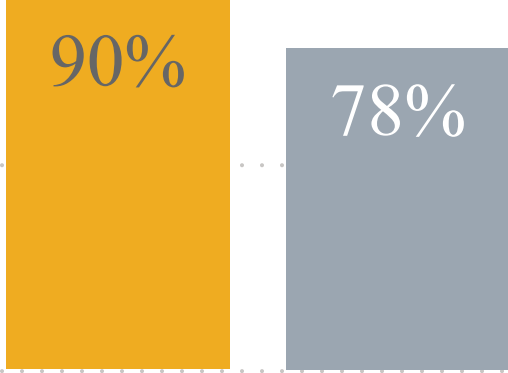

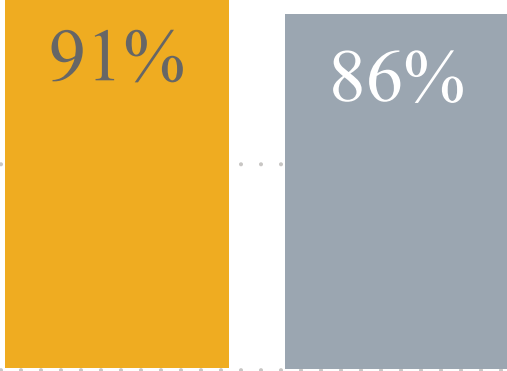
## Arizona: Principal Subtest 2

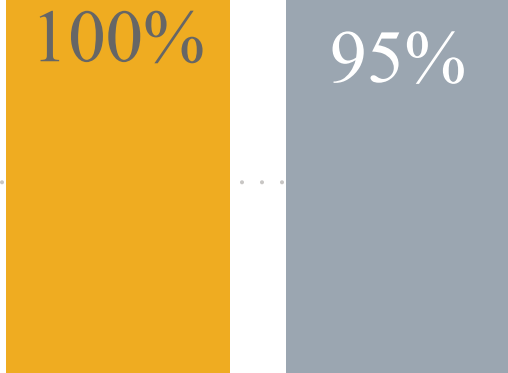

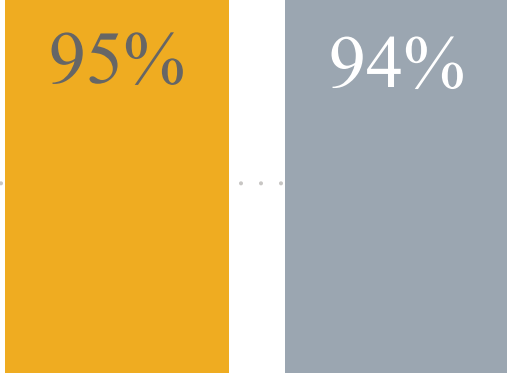
## Indiana: Principles of Learn & Teaching: K-6

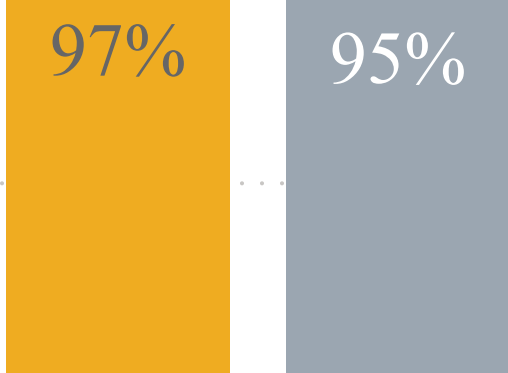
## Indiana: Principles of Learn & Teaching: 7-12

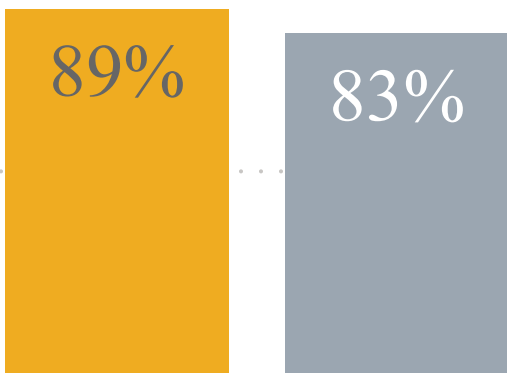

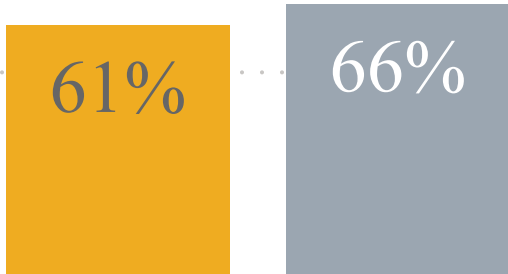

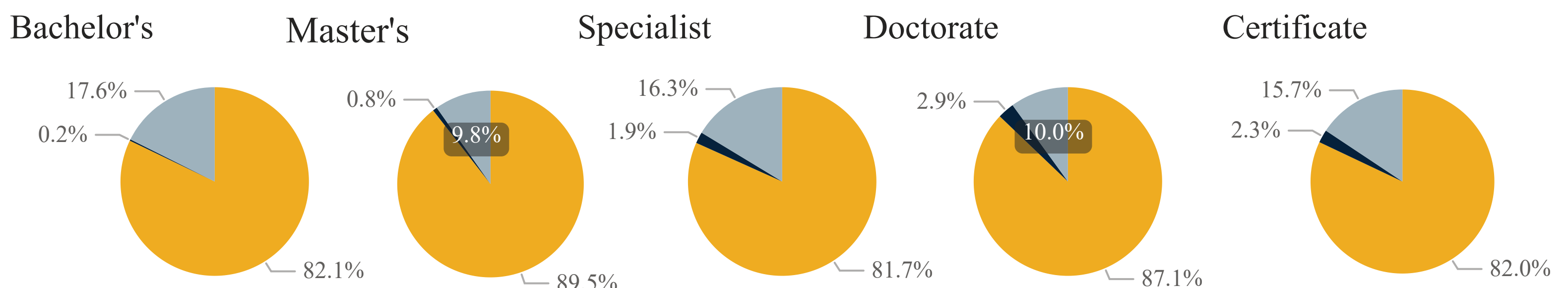

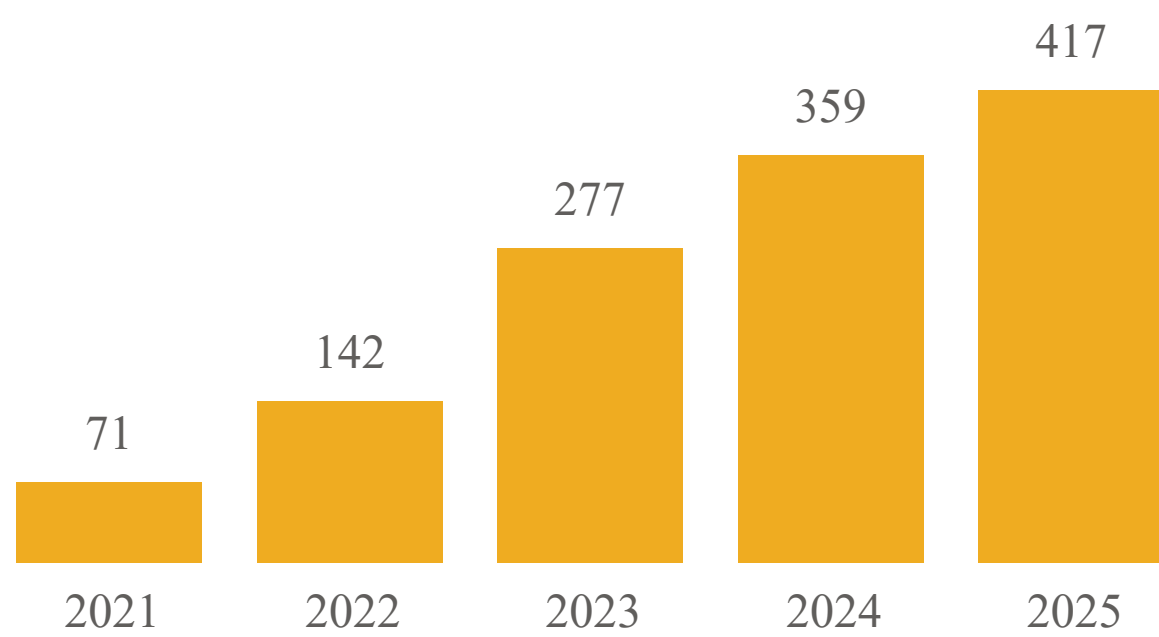

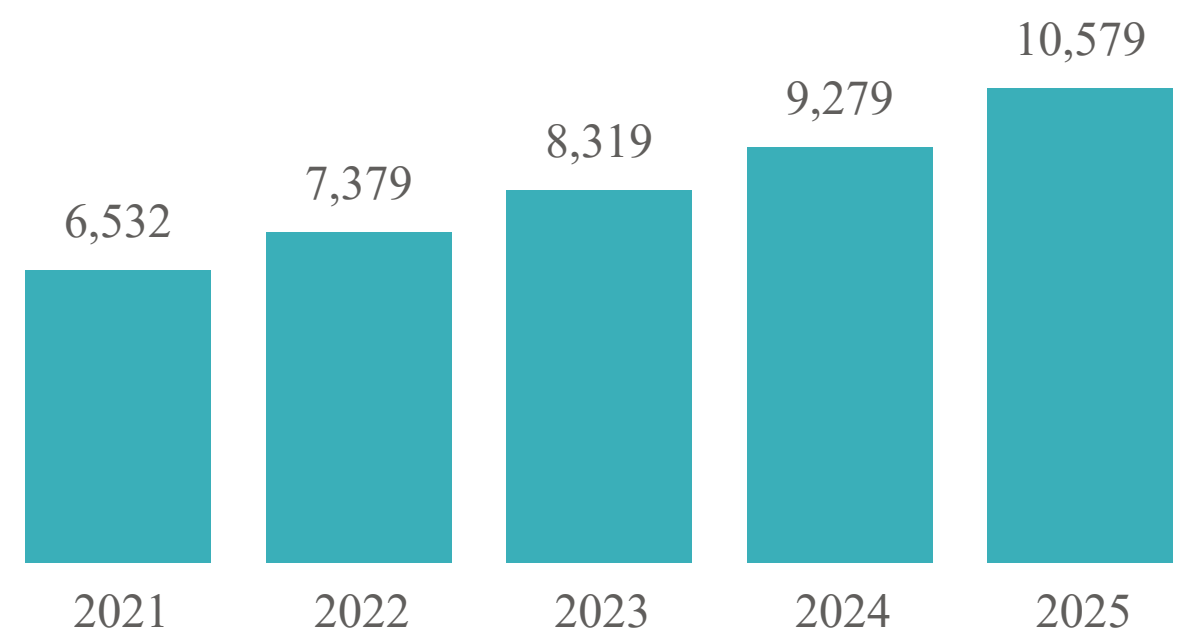

# Graduation Metrics

## Graduation Rates Over Time by Degree Level

ACE calculates graduation rates each year. These rates show the percentage of students who finish their program within the expected amount of time, based on when they first started in a specific group of students (called a cohort). Each student is counted only once for each degree level, even if they take more than one program at that level.

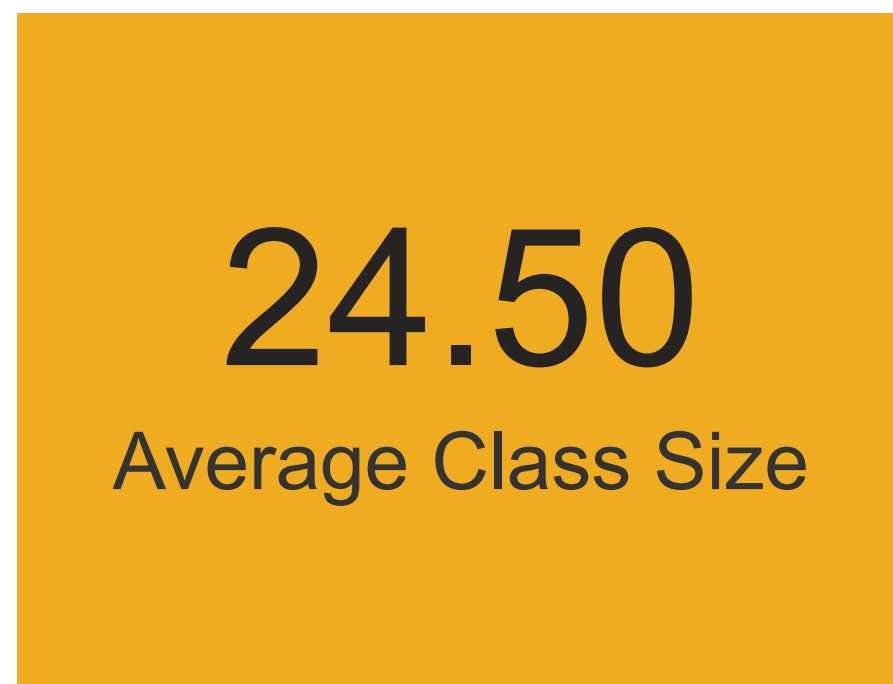

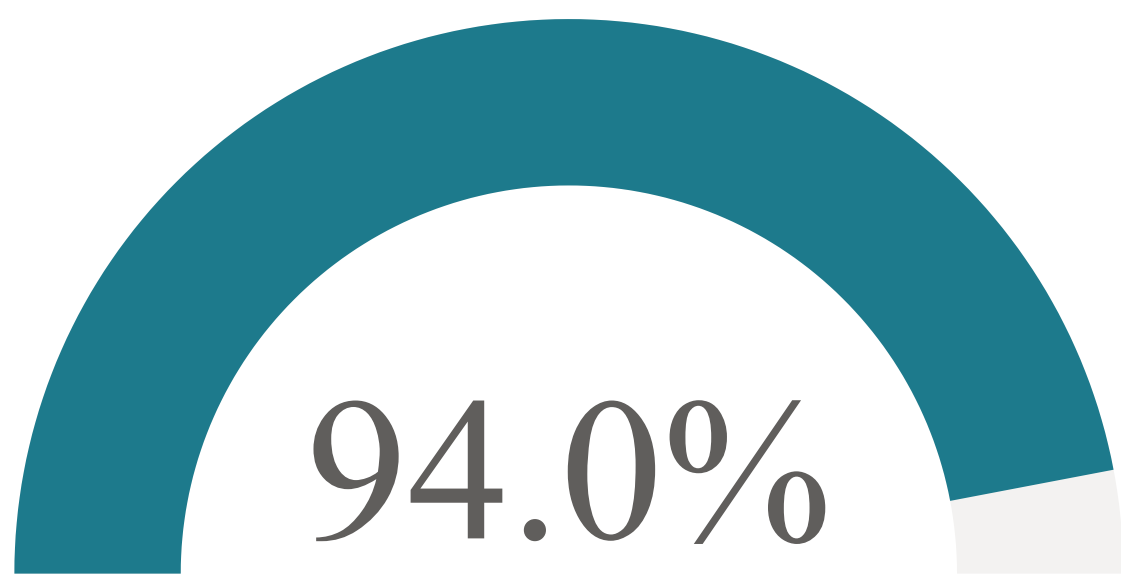

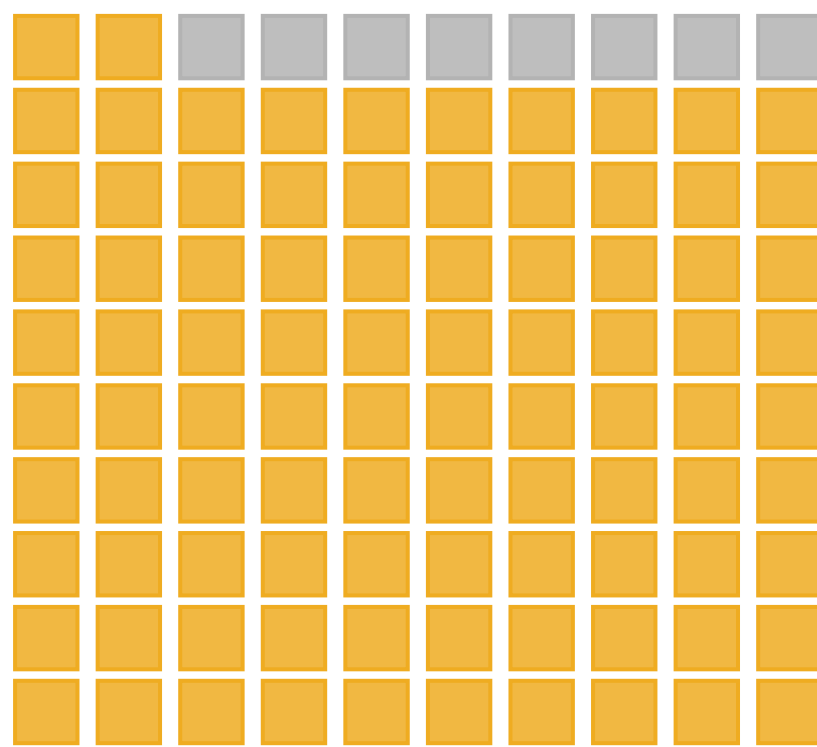

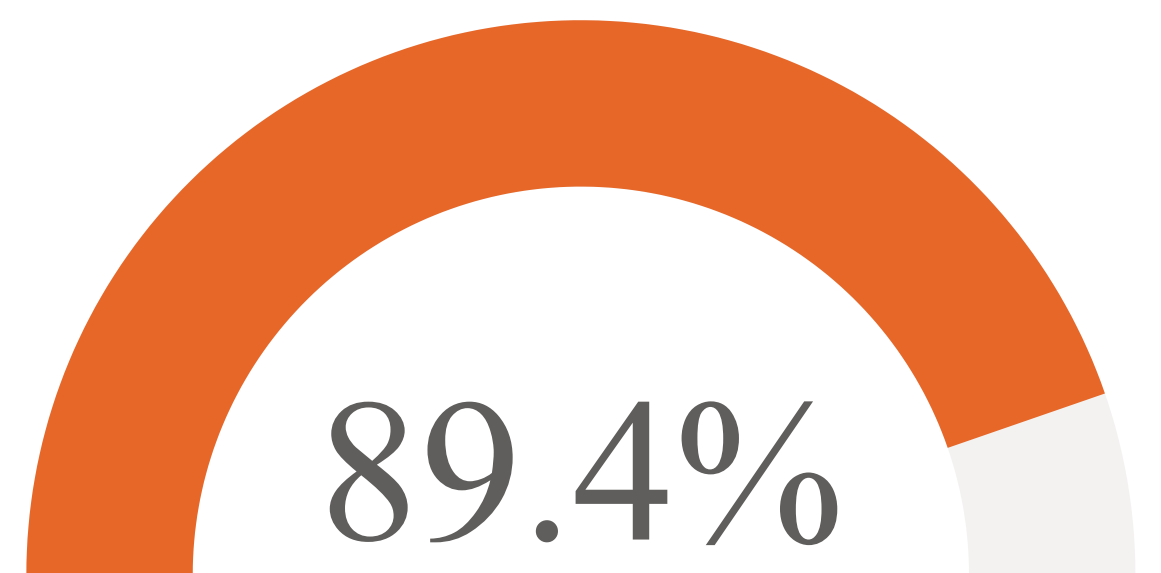
